The Jackson County Child Advocacy Center (JCCAC) offers supportive services to children when there are allegations of sexual abuse. All services provided at our CACs are free to the child and their non-offending caregiver. The demand for these services in our community is high, and as we recover from the pandemic we expect the number of cases to increase. First, we need expanded and more-efficient space at our current facility. Second, we need your help to make that possible.

We are raising funds for the expansion and renovation of our center to better serve the children in the Jackson and surrounding communities who need our services. Your participation in the *JCCAC Bike-a-Thon: Cycle Against Child Abuse* will bring us closer to breaking ground. We have already raised \$245,000 of the \$289,000 but we need your help to close this gap.

Wright, LMSW, CAADC, CCS Manager of Outpatient Substance Use Disorder Services At Catholic Charities of Jackson, Lenawee & Hillsdale Counties, substance use disorder services are provided through our *Bridges to Recovery* program. This program supports a person's journey toward recovery and wellness by creating and sustaining networks of formal and informal services and supports. The opportunities established through collaboration, partnership, and a broad array of services promote life-enhancing recovery and wellness for individuals, families, and communities. *Bridges to Recovery* utilizes a team approach; these team members are available to meet with clients in individual and group settings. Team members include therapists, peer recovery coaches, case managers, administrative coordinators, and program supervisors.

During the Covid-19 pandemic, we have had to be flexible and adjust to the ever-changing landscape. There have been times when we were not able to provide group services due to changes in regulations; however, during those times we were still able to see clients individually, either in person or via telehealth. Continuing our services provided support for people with substance use disorders by helping to keep them out of isolation, which can be detrimental to a person who is struggling with substance. We also connected clients to virtual 12-step meetings — and other recovery pathways — to encourage connection to others.

Many of our staff have been impacted by substance use disorders through their own families or with their own journeys in recovery. We have a deep understanding of the barriers that people face when they come into recovery and we are always here to lend a helping hand. It is an honor for us to be here and guide others through those difficult first few months of recovery; it inspires us to see someone flourish and move toward a life filled with meaning and purpose. Recovery is indeed a journey and we are here to walk that pathway with our clients.
