## St. Patrick's Day Box Lunch Benefit: A Chance to Serve

Catholic Charities and an amazing volunteer team recently wrapped up a successful St. Patrick's Day box lunch benefit. Now in its 6th year, 1,600 lunches were prepared and delivered to recipients in Jackson and Lenawee Counties, raising \$13,800 to support the mission of Catholic Charities.

"April is National Volunteer Month and we salute our many volunteers who support us throughout the year," said Sr. Barb Quincey, O.P., a former teacher at Lumen Christi High School and current Catholic Charities board member, and originator of the St. Patrick's event fundraiser. "It's a lot of fun working with the volunteers on this project. So many of them return each year and that helps make everything run so

smoothly." Fellow board member Jean Kaisler organizes volunteers for this annual event.

More than 70 adults representing several Catholic parishes in Jackson and Adrian and other volunteers give their time to help pick up supplies; assemble corned-beef sandwiches; make coleslaw and cookies; and pack and deliver the box lunches to area businesses and individuals.

"I'm always looking for an opportunity for our classroom to provide service to the community. Every class has thoroughly enjoyed assisting with this project. When we talk about the services that Catholic Charities provides, the kids are that much more vested in their efforts. The leadership and teamwork my students put forth is heartwarming to see in action," adds Betsy.


